- Newly introduced carnivals not readily accepted eg. 5-a-side Field Soccer
- Behaviour issues down to one. This speaks highly of the personnel involved and the policies in place.
- The carnival conveners keep the program going and both the experienced and new conveners have been exceptional and their efforts certainly appreciated. Congratulations to all of them.
- Some issues that still need addressing:-
 - Student officials (need to educate not use and abuse)
 - Teacher supervision (need to be actively present)
 - Team nomination imbalances (seven teams may see a school with two teams entered reduced to one)
 - Late withdrawals (have been a real problem this year. Fines?)
 - Payment of officials a consideration (\$60 an hour in Adelaide with schools paying)
- Is there anything that the group needs to be in-serviced on eg. pole vaulting, marking an Athletics track?
- Meeting reimbursement reminder.

SSSSA REPORT (Kevin Gruhl)

- Team Compositions: Schools are reminded that they can join up if it means that students can then participate in physical activity. Small schools should certainly consider this option
- Recommendations for Swimming Carnivals:-
 - That the points scoring system be 1st – 16 points, 2nd – 14 points, 3rd – 12 points, 4th – 10 points, 5th – 8 points, 6th – 6 points, 7th – 4 points, 8th – 2 points so participants are awarded for gaining higher positions from 4th to 8th.
 - That the handicap system includes points from the previous two years and enrolments for the current year.
 - That Ceduna enters a team in the Central Eyre Carnival.
 - That Karcultaby and Lock Area Schools combine to ensure a more competitive team is involved.
